

A CHANGELESS GOD IN A CHANGING WORLD

"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." Hebrews 13:8


Hebrews 13:8 was the theme verse for this year's Pastors conference with the Pacific Southwest District. I was blessed to be able to attend this year's conference (my 16th year in our district!) along with Rachelle and learn a number of things about how our God remains changeless even in a rapidly changing world.

It seems that with all the news about Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump dominating the media (and our conversations) it is clear that we are living in a changing world. Our older members see this when they consider how the culture of our society has changed in a handful of decades. Our younger members see this when they witness new technology emerging day after day, week after week, and year after year. It does seem as though the rate of change is speeding up not slowing down, doesn't it?

And so how does a Christian respond in these changing times? As we have been learning from the Apostle James in our "Faith That Works" message series, let me suggest that we put our faith into action, and let our thoughts and emotions be guided by our changeless God, rather than by the changing circumstances around us. How does God direct us ...

... In a changing WORLD? One trend that we must recognize globally is that the "West" (meaning Europe and North America) is no longer the epicenter

of Christianity. One conference speaker said that in the 1800's approximately 90% of Christians worldwide lived in Europe and North America. In the 1990s 60% of Christians were living in Africa, South



America Asia and the Pacific – and that trend is increasing. This means that as Christians, we need to respond in humility, not seeing ourselves as "rescuers" of Christians around the world, but *partnering* with them as together we serve the same God – diverse in cultures, but united in His Spirit. It also means that we must be careful that all of our ministry remains rooted in the Cross of Christ. Anything else won't transcend cultures, and ultimately won't matter.

... In a changing NATION? Trends in the business world have informed some church practices over the last several decades. Interestingly, what we are learning now is that the business world has begun moving toward "values-driven" leadership. What this means is that today's generation is more interested in what a company stands for than just the products they sell. This is a good thing for the Church because it means that this generation is interested

FAMILY MINISTRY CORNER

I feel as a parent I have trouble understanding that psychological and relational consequences don't influence real change, at best, it is temporary. Like a water faucet, I can turn on my anger, guilt messages and nagging but I am understanding this approach doesn't change behavior, decision — making or attitudes in my children. It doesn't influence my children's character, faith journey or life development. Genuine change comes from reality consequences such as losses of time, money, enjoyment, possessions and valued relationships. Genuine shaping comes from the natural outflows of success and the good we experience. We reap what we sow.

The Law of Sowing and Reaping is a law we depend on each day. Both positive and negative outcomes of this law shape us. For example;

If I work hard enough, I will advance.

If I eat all I want, I will gain weight or develop heart disease.

If I read my Bible, I will grow spiritually.

If I don't push myself in my job I will stay at the same at the same level.

Reaping and sowing gives us a reasonable sense of control and influence over our lives.

Our healthy fear of bad things keeps us living in reality and moving in a good direction. While understanding that diligence, perseverance and responsibility produce good fruits in life.

The Law of Sowing and Reaping produces the spiritual gift of self-control. The content of this law changes with age but the law remains the same. This law balances freedom, choices and consequences. It's not about micro-managing or controlling your children but influencing what they want. Most children desire things that are incompatible with each other. They desire things to go well, but they want it done in their terms. We parents desire things to go well for our children but we want them to do things right.

The key is balancing freedom, responsibility and consequences. If any of these is out of balance problems result. For example if more freedom is given than what a child is held responsible for, then character issues arise. As parents, the Law f Sowing and Reaping requires us to give kids freedom, hold them responsible, deliver consequences and love them throughout.

May our children live wisely, make good choices, do the right things and have a good life of faith in Jesus Christ.



SALT AND LIGHT

Throughout our brief history as a nation, the central vision was to have a government determined by and working for all of its people. In order to achieve that vision, voting laws have evolved over the years:

- -1788 all slaves counted as 3/5's of a single person
- -1870 15th Amendment allows all male citizens the right to vote
- -1920 19th Amendment guarantees all citizens regardless of gender the right to vote
- -1964 passage of the Civil Rights Act outlaws discrimination
- -1971 26th Amendment sets the minimum age for voting at 18
- -1990 American Disabilities Act ensures voting accommodations for those with disabilities
- -2009- Military and Overseas Empowerment Act helps troops overseas to vote more efficiently

Voting is one of the most cherished rights we have. The people we elect don't necessarily represent the beliefs of America. They represent the wishes of those who voted. Therefore, when Christians vote, their vote makes a makes a major difference. The easiest example is the 2010 election. It had the highest Christian turnout recorded. As a result, we had the highest number of candidates, who represented Biblical values, elected to legislatures, state and federal, of any previous election. They proceeded to pass legislation reflecting Christian values. We often hear that God and politics don't mix, but President Barack Obama said I in a speech

in 2006, "So to say that men and women should not inject their 'personal morality' into public policy debates is a practical absurdity. Our law is by definition a codification of morality, much of it grounded in Judeo-Christian tradition'.

To help Christians focus on what their candidates say about Biblical values, your Salt and Light group has prepared a voting guide. This easy to use guide only relays information as it relates to Biblical values. It will be available to you soon.

As one of our Founding Fathers said; Let each citizen remember at the moment he is offering his vote that he is not making a present or a compliment to please an individual — or at least that he ought not do so; but he is executing one of the most solemn trusts in human society for which he is accountable to God and his country. 7 HABITS OF HIGHLY EFFECTIVE STEWARDS

Habit 5: Live Within Your Means

What do you think when you read, "Live within your means?" Do you think, "Who me?"...yet often you find yourself wishing you had more money? Perhaps you have too much "month" at the end of the "money" because of a lifestyle you've created that is hard to maintain. Many times this may happen when we try to keep up with others and don't live within our means.

Discontent and financial difficulty can happen when we compare ourselves to those who have more. Some use comparison to justify spending more than they should..."keeping up with the Joneses". As Howard Dayton said in his book, Dollars and Sense, "someone once said that you can never keep up with the Joneses. Just about the time you catch them, they refinance their home and go deeper in debt to buy more things!"

We certainly live in a society of acquisition. Advertising is geared to encourage us to desire a better lifestyle and to aspire to a higher standard of living. According to society, we should acquire as many expensive possessions as possible because these things are evidence of a successful, important person. When we want to live this counterfeit, media-induced dream but cannot afford it, we suffer discontentment, envy and coveting. And, most importantly, it prevents us from giving freely and sacrificially back to God.

As God's stewards, our fundamental lifestyle choice is to concentrate on what we have instead of what we lack. Debt is a terrible trap in which to fall and an even harder one to escape. It's not surprising that the Bible discourages borrowing. In Prov. 22:7 we read, "...the borrower is servant to the lender". Yet, despite these warnings, it's easy to fall into the temptation of debt. As George Fooshee, author of You Can Beat

in the deeper issues that drive our ministry rather than just the externals of our presentation. But truthfully, this raises the bar for us. Today's younger worshippers are not attracted to simply a "slick presentation," but are more concerned with what is really driving our faith underneath. They want to see the changeless God shining through us. They want to join a church where people are deeply transformed by their relationship with God and are filled with the joy of the Holy Spirit. They want to belong to a church where the friendships are deep, marriages are strong, and the people are full of joy and love. Unfortunately, when they look at the Church, they don't see patterns of spiritual and relational health that are much different than the world. Quite simply we cannot have a faith that is divorced from our life. This generation is not interested in our knowledge. They need someone to show them Jesus. Let's show them the unchanging God who is "making his appeal through us." (2 Corinthians 5:19)

... In a changing COMMUNITY? At Redeemer we want to "Join Jesus in our Community." This means that we actually need to get out into our community. You will be seeing more opportunities at Redeemer to get the message of the Gospel out to our neighbors and friends. But at the same time, you need to begin to expand your "invite list." Ask God to reveal to you: Who are the people in the circles that you travel? Where is God already at work in their life? Where can you shine the light of Jesus into

both their joys and their struggles? Who is God leading you to invite with you along your journey of loving and serving the Lord and His people?

... In a changing HOME? Unfortunately, the landscape of our homes has also changed in recent decades. Sadly, many children experience homes where faith is not evident. Perhaps even more sadly, though, many children grow up in *Christian* homes where the faith that is professed on Sunday somehow does not make it to the home on Monday. Too often our homes have "outsourced" the faith education of their children. The message of the Church needs to be bolstered in our families as we continue to expose our children at all ages and stages of life to the unchanging God who is there for them, reaches down to them, loves them, saves them, and who calls them to Himself!

At Redeemer, we share a <u>Changeless God in a Changing</u> <u>World</u> - with <u>people groups</u> who don't look like us - with

a nation that desperately needs to see the faith of Christians expressed with authenticity and integrity - with a community that needs us as much as we need them - and with homes that are rich in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18)!
