The phrase "Joining Jesus in our Community" is sounding more and more familiar around Redeemer, isn't it? This is what we believe God wants us to be doing as we fulfill our mission to make disciples. But there is one question that still needs to be tackled – What will that look like when we are doing it? And so, on Saturday January 28th, we began a

planning process that will lead us to greater clarity and unity around this question.

We believe that for us to advance our mission and ministry together, we must have unity and clarity around not just vision, but around values and behaviors. In fact, the single greatest hindrance to mission advancement is what our consultant, Bill Walker, referred to as "Nodding Heads & Folded Arms." That's where wellmeaning church members "nod" when they hear the vision (who doesn't want to join Jesus in His mission?) but then "fold their arms" while they wait for someone else to figure out what needs to be done. In other words, we not only need vision clarity, but we need *substantial* clarity – clarity that affects what we value and what we do.

Churches can suffer from "churn" (where people visit, but don't connect to the church), "competition" (where ministries within the church vie for attention, resources, and volunteers), and "burnout" (what happens when everything is equally important). This happens when there are just too many game-plans in play.



SALT AND LIGHT

Your Salt & Light Ministry, as well as other similarly minded groups throughout this nation, organized in order to encourage Christians to vote in the 2016 elections. Our group came up with a voters guide that informed you of how candidates for office (federal, state, and local) stood on several Biblical issues. As a result of this 'united in purpose' effort, 26% of voters in this election were Evangelical Christians, according to Time.com and others. They voted for preserving the sanctity of life for the unborn, traditional marriage, and recognizing our constitutionally protected religious freedoms. How does this fit with the historical context of the United States?

Today, the U. S. is the longest ongoing constitutional republic. There were other countries who had revolutions at the time of the American Revolution such as France, Russia, Italy, Haiti and Greece. While the U. S. has had 1 government, France has had 15, Russia had 4 in the 20th century alone, Afghanistan 5 and Poland 7. They all had access to the same political philosophies as did the U. S. So, what did our Founding Fathers select that other nations did not? It is found in our Declaration of Independence with the acknowledgement that our rights come from God, not man.

In an effort to account for the original sources from where our governmental foundations came political science professors got together to analyze over 15,000 historical documents and 3,000 quotes. The findings were documented in "The Origins of American Constitutionalism" by Donald Lutz. They found that well known philosophers and political thinkers like Montesquieu, Blackstone, and Locke were significant contributors but accounted for less than 10% as sources for the structure of our original government. The leading source was... the Bible at 34%. For instance *Isaiah 33:22 sets forth 3 distinct branches of government. Jeremiah 17:9 establishes the logic for the separation of powers. Ezra 7:24 gives the basis of tax exemption for churches.*

Many of our historical giants have recognized publicly the importance of religion to our well-being. John Adams said "The general principles on which the fathers achieved independence were...the general principles of Christianity." George Washington in explaining why the American political system had been so successful said "Of all the dispositions and habits which lead to political prosperity, religion and morality are indispensable supports. In vain would that man claim the tribute of patriotism, who should labor to subvert these great pillars." John Jay, Abe Lincoln, Theodore Roosevelt, Danial Webster, Federick Douglass and many others had similar feelings. Finally, in 1892 the U.S. Supreme Court wrote as part of a unanimous decision "No purpose of action against religion can be imputed to any legislation, state or national, because this is a religious people...This is a Christian nation" and they went on to site 80 precedents proving that the U.S. was a Christian nation.

Does this sound like our nation today to you? Why not join our Salt & Light Ministry and join us in protecting and restoring the Biblical values on which this nation was founded and has been so richly blessed?

FAMILY MINISTRY CORNER

THE LAW OF MOTIVATION

In my household it's the dishes. My wife and I struggled to motivate our kids to do the one chore for which they were responsible. Kids can be more than just defiant, they can be argumentative, manipulative and at times out of control. I can hear you know saying, what does this have to do with motivation? Motives drive our behavior. The problem is the behavior gets our attention. The behavior is the urgent matter. If there is a fire in our kitchen, we are more concerned with putting it out and

(Jesus) said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person." *Mark 7:20-23*

not how it started. Once we have our children's attention, motivation can be developed.

Love and the demands of reality play the significant role in the stages of motivational development. They establish the boundaries and limits of behaviors. We each in our life time have gone through these stages. Rooted in love and grace, each of the stages are experienced and not skipped over. Children only internalize boundaries within a grace-filled and loving relationship. Otherwise they experience rules and limitations as a judgement or something to hate or resent. I'm not saying that kids will then enjoy their limitations or responsibilities. The end result parents strive is a self-controlled child who accepts their boundaries willingly and for the right reasons.

Parents help children develop motivation by navigating them through the following stages;

1. Fear of Consequences- Set boundaries with clear consequences for your children when a boundary is violated. Children will test the limits, complain and express the unfairness of the boundary or consequence. Don't budge, be consistent, love them and empathize with the flood of emotions from your child. You have their attention. They are learning they are not the center of the universe.

2. An Immature Conscience-In this stage children develop a healthy understanding of consequences. Often they are critical of themselves and may even mimic your words or those of other authorities or significant relationships. They are internalizing their experience with consequences. Internalization is a critical component in everyone's ability to love, be selfcontrolled and aware of set of values and ethics. It shapes our conscience. **3. Values and Ethics-** At this stage the criticism changes from self to the behavior or action. This indicates maturity and a system of values in the child. The boundaries are now an extension of themselves and not an imitation of authority figures. Guilt and shame become real and so does the desire to be good.

4. Mature Love, Mature Guilt- At this stage children have a well-developed framework of values and ethics. Right and wrong don't motivate as much as love does. Concern for relationships becomes the greatest motivation.

Dr. Henry Cloud and Dr. John Townsend in their book <u>Boundaries with Kids</u> explain these stages and the mistakes to avoid. They encourage us to be subject to these motivations and stages and provide experiences for our children to own and internalize boundaries and limitations.


B.C. MISSION BOAT





ADVANCING THE MISSION, CONT.

Think of any sport you like – got one in mind? I bet that game has rules and boundaries; and those teams that excel at that sport have a game-plan that they're all working toward, together.

What this means for the church is that we don't have to try and find the "right" way of doing church. In fact, there is probably no single right way to do church. But we do need to do church *one* way - together. Consider a boat full of people with oars. Everyone can be paddling their hardest ... but if they aren't paddling in the same direction they'll make a big splash, but will go nowhere fast.

As such, we are setting major milestones for this planning effort. They are:

- Clarity We are forming a "Mission Advancement Team" that will put a clarifying & compelling case for unity before the Church Council. If the Council approves, Redeemer will adopt that approach.
- Movement The mindset of the leadership, staff and volunteers shifts from "doing whatever is right in my eyes" to "how does my area of ministry support and increase the efforts we are all working toward?" In this stage, we will see grassroots changes begin to take place.
- 3. Alignment At this point, meetings and activities are organized around how to do what is absolutely essential and eliminating distractions, redundancy and sideways effort.

We will not arrive at all of these milestones at once, but these are the indicators we will look for before moving on to the next phase or milestone.

See, God wants unity in His Church. Why? Because it reflects His being ... God is internally and perfectly united in the Trinity. The world longs for unity, and therefore seeing unity of mind and purpose within the Church of God is perhaps our most attractive outreach! The Old and New Testaments agree on God's desire for this among His people:

"How good and pleasant it is when God's people live together in unity!" – Psalm 133:1

"I appeal to you, brothers and sisters, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree with one another in what you say and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be perfectly united in mind and thought." – 1 Corinthians 1:10

Jesus even prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, "... May they also be in us so that the world may believe that you have sent me." – John 17:21. In other words, the more united we are – with each other, and with God – the more the world will see Jesus in us, and put their faith in Him!

It's a tall order, and it means that we all need to be in prayer – asking God to give us that burden to do what it takes to reach people with the Gospel and to Join Jesus in His Mission to seek and save the lost in our community. Are you ready? Let's go! ... May the Name of Jesus be lifted high among us, and may the world be drawn to Him through our words and deeds.
