LAYING A FOUNDATION


For no one can lay any foundation other than the one already laid, which is Jesus Christ. 1 Corinthians 2:12

Living in Arizona and Southern California, we've seen a lot of new construction over the last couple decades. One thing you notice as you go by a construction site day after day is the amount of time that is spent on the property before you ever see a wall go up. Then once the walls go up, it seems like it isn't long before the occupants are moving in. There is extensive sitework – grading, utilities and concrete – that goes into every project. Laying a foundation is so important, that *This Old House* has an article on their website entitled, "A foundation is forever – how to do it right."

We have a foundation to our faith. It's the bedrock on which our faith is built. The cornerstone of that foundation is Christ. This means that the foundation of our life as the people of God is built upon Him. In the months of January and February, we will be looking at the teachings of Scripture that illuminate the foundation of our faith and we will see how they center on Christ and shape our everyday lives.

Here's a brief look at the upcoming messages:

- Jan. 8 **The Story**. The story of the Bible moves from God's Creation to Our Fall to Christ's Redemption to the Final Restoration. In the introduction to this series, we look at how Christ undoes the curse of our Fall into sin by becoming cursed on a cross.
- Jan 15 The Word. Jesus gives us words in His teaching and He is the Word made flesh. Thus, it is vital that we hear and practice His Word.

SALT AND LIGHT

What does the future of America look like after the recent divisive election? Will it be a continuing of the division that has been the hallmark of recent years, or will there be a coming together. This is not suggesting we are all going to agree on things like how to avoid war, or the benefits of trickle-down economics. Those are issues for the professionals to deal with. But the Biblical and moral issues of our time are areas where the American people really agree on more than they disagree.

When the truth about issues of morality is made clear, we see a uniting of the American people. For example when it was made clear that the Chic-Fil-a owner was being attacked simply because he supported traditional marriage, people across America rallied to show their support by coming in droves to his stores; *I think their sales have remained high, even after the 'rally' was over.* That type of clarity is needed in many areas. Our religious liberties are under attack, I believe mostly due to misinformation about what that means. Traditional marriage is demeaned by a small minority in order to promote an agenda. Attempts to restrict abortion frequently fail, in part due to the impacts of abortion not being talked about in the public square.

Are Christians waking up? This past election Evangelical Christians *(those who say being a Christian is an important part of their life)* comprised a record 26% of the electorate and voted 81% for the Presidential Candidate who - understands there is a war against Christians in America; who promises to defund Planned Parenthood; who supports restrictions on abortion; and who proudly says Merry Christmas.

As we strive to inform our congregation about Christian responsibilities in the civil arena, an upcoming event will help; a visit by Dran Reese, Founder of the Salt & Light Council (Tuesday, January 17, 2017, at 6:45 pm in the Fellowship Hall.) She will speak on the topic at the core of what we are about "Churches Role in Civil Government". Then, the following three Sundays, your Redeemer Salt & Light group will provide a study from Lutheran Hour Ministries titled "Two Kingdoms". For the Christian, his or her citizenship is an opportunity to serve in both the affairs of earthly government and the mission of the Christian Church on earth. Questions raised will help you understand the demanding balance between Church and State. The study will be provided between services in the Fellowship Hall, beginning on January the 22nd.

THE LAW OF RESPECT

I can remember my first day of Kindergarten. I did not want to be separated from my mother. It wasn't until Mrs. Poland and my Mom showed me it was OK. I would be fine. They empathized with me but helped me understand I need to go to school, my teacher needed to teach and my Mom needed to leave and go about her day. I was learning to respect the needs, choices and feelings of others.

Children don't enter life knowing how to respect others. They need to learn

- To feel sad instead of mad when they don't get their way.
- To respect the "no" of others.
- To understand individuality.

All people need to live with and in the nature of reality. As we grow and mature, our limits and boundaries gain clarity. We can determine what we can change or influence. We also know when we need to move past the protest, accept what we can't change. Accepting loss and that which we cannot have and moving on is essential in life. Sadness is an indication of living in reality. The life lesson is that life is sad sometimes. We don't always get our way. Now we must move on. Children naturally do not respect limits. The challenge to us as parents is our response when they express disrespect or hatred to boundaries. Empathy and correction are good solutions, enabling a child to apologize and self-correct. If they continue however, consequences are in order. Kids need to learn that when "no" is not respected it hurts people and will cost them relationships.

Our freedom and individuality separate us into unique people and are a critical components of every relationship. Increasing separateness from Mom and Dad and Mom and Dad from child is important to the growing respect for and understanding of our separateness. This lesson in life shapes a child's use of space and time. It influences their choice of friends, their appearance, and their ability to empathize with others. Both parent and child need to know that life does not revolve around them if they are to succeed in nurturing relationships.

Parents play the critical role in the Law of Respect. It's their mission to change the natural disrespect for limits to a healthy respect for boundaries. While it's normal for disrespect to occur, it's not normal for it to continue. Letting the reality of a child's world to teach them combined with the empathy and limits of parent support is a strong formula for learning the Law of Respect.

pizza at Leucadia Pizza. It's free! They just need your help in making a difference. Service hours are awarded! RSVP by Sunday, January 8.




SUNDAY SCHOOL

Habit 6: Give Time and Talent


Hello RBTS Church Family and Friends!

LAYING A FOUNDATION, CONT.

In this message we talk about the nature and character of Jesus' words – how they are perfect – and how they call us both to faith and to action.

- Jan 29 The Gathering. Worship is the natural and inevitable response of people who have faith in God to a good God. In this message, we look at the nature of worship, the location of worship, and the focus of worship in the Christian life.
- Feb 5 **The Water**. In the last chapter of Matthew, Jesus calls us to make disciples in two ways: by teaching His Word and by baptizing in His name (Matthew 28:19-20). The Ethiopian eunuch becomes a disciple by baptism. Jesus still makes disciples in baptism today!
- Feb 12 The Meal. When Jesus celebrates the Passover with His disciples the night before He dies, it becomes more than a Passover. It becomes a promise of His presence. For in, with, and under simple forms of bread and wine is the body and blood of Christ. In this message, we look at the Passover and how Jesus' death on a cross leads God not to merely pass-over our sins, but to forgive them!
- Feb 19 The Mission. The call of every Christian is to live beyond themselves. We are to share the hope that we have with the world. When some lepers stumble into an Aramean camp that has been emptied by God, and when they find all sorts of treasure there, they cannot help but share the good news of the treasure with their neighbors. How can

we do anything less than share the good news of the gospel with our neighbors?

I am praying that this series will engage believers by teaching the foundations of what we believe and why we believe it. I am also hopeful that through it we will gain a deeper Biblical understanding of our faith and how to apply it to our daily lives. In other words, we will ask the questions "What does this mean?" and "What does this look like lived out in our lives?"

For those who are new to the Christian faith, these teachings will provide a firm foundation on which to build a lifetime of discipleship! Jesus said, "*Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock.*" – Matthew 7:24. Note: There are free Growth Group videos and printed study guides available for this series. Consider using them in your Growth Group or starting a new group that follows this message series.

2017 promises to be a year of great progress for our congregation. Beginning at the end of the month we will embark on a vision clarification process (mark

your calendars for January 28th 9 to 11am) – the foundation of which must be Jesus Christ and His mission in our community. I look forward to this next year with you ...
