

WHY ARE WE DOING THIS?

"You are the salt of the earth. ... You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden."

- Matthew 5:13-14

Have you ever had 'one of those days' — perhaps as a parent, as a teacher or in your workplace? You know what I mean... a day when everything seems to be challenging you... or an entire season that seems like one step forward and two steps backward? It's times like that when you find yourself asking the question — "why am I doing this?" Maybe you even ask a friend or your spouse, "tell me again — why did we decide to do this?" It is times like that which test your resolve, your determination and your motivation.

Is it any surprise that ministry is challenging? Why wouldn't it be? Anytime that we, as Christians, attempt to do the Lord's work, we are stepping out on the battlefield. On that battlefield, Satan is our opponent; and he will stop at nothing to try and defeat us. And if he can't defeat us, he'll try to defer us, delay us and distract us. Distraction is perhaps one of his most powerful weapons. If Satan can take our minds and our hearts off of our God-given goals, then he has a foothold by which to begin chipping away at our effectiveness. Once the enemy has succeeded at distracting us, then he can move on to discouraging us. To avoid being delayed, distracted, discouraged and otherwise "derailed" by Satan, we need to regularly ask ourselves the question, "Why are we doing this?" and so return to our God-given purpose. We need to remind ourselves the

motivating and driving force behind our efforts, otherwise "when the going gets tough" as they say, we may lose heart.

So, why are we doing this? Why are we growing a Christian church in Carlsbad? Quite simply, because the community NEEDS us! That's right – whether they know it or not, we have what they need - God. I have read a number of articles that point out that we no longer live in a "church culture." In fact, they describe our era as "post-Christian." That means that on average, people no longer see the church as a relevant part of their life - they have little use for it. What these reports imply is that we cannot wait for people to "accidentally find us" (because they aren't looking). Instead, our role is to "bring light into a culture that is growing dimmer and dimmer." We are doing this because our Lord charges us to be the salt and light of the earth! (Matthew 5:13-14). We may have challenges in ministry. We may even have obstacles in front of us - those of the enemy, and those of our own making. But the Lord has made his call on our life clear - to pervade our world with

the message of the Gospel. We cannot shrink back from the task he has given us – too many people are counting on us!

GROWTH GROUPS, CONT. SALT & LIGHT

There is much good in America - We are the most generous and giving country in the world, ranking number one on the World Giving Index. America is the world's defender of freedom. Yet with all the good, there are also things that need attention: Religious Liberty, the very foundation of America, continues to be under attack right here at home; people are punished for not participating in events or activities that go against their religious beliefs; traditional marriage is mocked; abortion is supported, or even promoted, by any number of activist courts; young children are being told they can decide what gender they would like to be; and people of faith, against their will, are forced to pay for abortions. What are we to do?

Scripture gives us the starting point for our mission - Exodus 18:21 "But select capable men from all the people—men who fear God, trustworthy men who hate dishonest gain—and appoint them as officials over thousands, hundreds, fifties and tens."

Participating in the selection of our leaders is the duty of all Christian Citizens. At Salt & Light, our vision is for a future America where the leaders we elect, in all areas of government, will be judged in a significant part based on their adherence to Biblical principles. The Founding Fathers developed our Constitution for a religious a people and it is our role to return to that judgement when we go to the voting booth. Only when the Christian Community in America gets informed on the issues important to the Church; when they know the

position held by candidates for office; and when they vote, will our country turn back to God.

So, how is the Salt & Light group at Redeemer, going to make a difference? REMODEL PROJECT

We are underway! You may have noticed we are beginning to experience some sawdust or other things that go along with the improvements the Congregation authorized in September. The goal for this project is maximizing the usefulness of our facility and the changes now underway incorporate the experience we have gained to date in using the building. Both the existing and future ministry programs will benefit from these enhancements.

The first thing you will see will be in the Fellowship Hall and will include a nicer wallcovering over the block wall and as things progress the lighting will

change to down pointing lights; the ceiling will be sound insulated and the rough beams across the ceiling will get a wrap of drywall. After that, entry doors will be installed and with the audio and video additions it will make the room capable of functioning as two independent meeting areas; effectively adding a room to the Church.

The expectation is that the work in the Sanctuary, Narthex and the Fellowship Hall will be completed in less than six months, so any disruptions we may experience will be short lived. Also Church Design and Construction (CDC), our vendor, has committed to take the necessary steps to minimize any distractions.

What does LWML do?

We support missions with mite boxes and donation to missionaries. In 2017, we gave to Lutheran Bible Translators, Mission Aviation, Gift from the Heart, Orphan Grain Trans and many more. We aid RBTS church services by preparing Communion and altar flowers, disseminate the prayer chain emails, send cards to members, present gifts to new members, baptisms and confirmands. We organize receptions for funerals/memorials, sewing club which makes walker bags and things for convalescent homes We have a 'Coupon Program' that serves the military at some of the bases, abroad. And, we provide food and transportation for short term needs within the congre-

gation. to name a few. In 2018, we will continue these services, as well as, increase our support towards community outreach with small projects and so forth.

LWML oversees collections and sending the money to the National Lutheran in Mission (LWML) organization, who in turn use the 100% of the monies for missions. Mite boxes are located on the LWML table in the Narthex. The large wooden collection box on the same table is where you deposit mite box when full. It is amazing how much money we collect!


What a wonderful time was had by all! We sang, drank and indulged in a Italian meal.

PARENTING CHRISTIAN KIDS: SPARK THE JOY OF DISCOVERY

""O Sovereign LORD! You made the heavens and earth by your strong hand and powerful arm. Nothing is too hard for you!" - Jeremiah 32:17, NLT

Spending time with children can be unpredictable—and can lead to many God-moments. Through their vivid imaginations, children become part of God's unfolding story with a sense of innocence and trust that we lose as adults. There's no rush to confront little ones with reality; that happens soon enough. Set aside criticism, competition, structure, and comparisons. Instead, emphasize praise, acceptance, freedom, insights, and smiles. Rushing squelches curiosity, so allow plenty of time for your children to make and share their discoveries. Welcome their questions, even if you don't have all the answers. And remember to show curiosity yourself, because that mindset is contagious! Try these ideas for revealing biblical truths through imagination and creative exploration.

It's a Draw Set out art supplies and draw, paint, or sculpt Bible events. Celebrate children's creativity, and find opportunities to link their abstract art with God's creation and his Word.

Action! Encourage children to engage with Bible events by acting them out together. After reading aloud from a children's Bible or Bible storybook, dress up, role-play, and improvise dialogue. Allow embellishment and laughter.

Creative Creation Together, brainstorm things God

created. Read aloud Genesis 1:27. Say: "Because we're made in God's image, we're creative too!" Set out shapes cut from different colors of construction paper. Have family members design pictures of God's creation (animals, flowers, people, and so on).

Curious Questions While reading the Bible together, encourage children's curiosity by asking questions such as "How might [Bible person] tell about this event? What do you think he or she saw? smelled? tasted? touched? What other choices did this person have? What in these Bible verses do you want to do? What do you *not* want to do?"

Make Merry Create homemade tambourines and then make joyful noises of worship to God. Sing and dance, waving ribbons for extra effects. Older kids can write songs about a Bible passage.

STEM Stimulation Incorporate other subjects into Bible time. Use math to demonstrate 40 days of the flood, 40 days of temptation, or forgiving 70 times 7. Do research to find out what's in a drop of pond water. Use blocks to build the Tower of Babel or the Temple.

Snacks Make Things "Stick" Research shows that snacks affect children's memories because food connects to emotions. So make and enjoy Bible-themed snacks that tie into lessons. Use animal crackers, goldfish crackers, blue gelatin (for water), marshmallows (for sheep), and so on. Search online for easy recipes related to each lesson.

Everyday Examples Use a variety of household items to reinforce Bible truths. For example, place a dried-up sponge in a pan of water and discuss the changes that take place in us when we know Jesus. Pull some tissues out of a box and explain how the church is a bunch of people holding up one another.

STEWARDSHIP

It's a new year. It's a time when we take stock of the year past in order to improve the year to come. It's a time when we sit down to plan and implement what we want to accomplish and even change. Part of that is planning our stewardship for the coming year.

Often we find this difficult and daunting and even joyless. But it doesn't have to be. In fact, it is really quite simple and full of joy. So here are some tips to make that planning less stressful. You begin by answering these three questions: Who are you? To whom do I give? And how much?

So, who are you? The Table of Duties in the Small Catechism informs us. Are you a hearer of God's Word? Are you a citizen of society? Are you a member of a family? Stewardship covers these three estates: church, society, family. We don't particularly struggle to give to society or family. Our struggles, our difficulties and our questions arise in giving to the church.

So, what is our duty as members of the church with regard to giving? The Table of Duties, again, gives us a guide. If you are a hearer, a member of the church who receives instruction, St. Paul taught: "Anyone who receives instruction in the word must share all good things with his instructor" (Gal. 6:6). This means the local congregation is primary.

Your pastor is the one called to preach the Gospel to you and administer the Lord's blessed sacraments to

you. Your congregation is the place where those things happen. Thus, when God calls us to give to the church, He has the local congregation in mind. For "the Lord has commanded that those who preach the gospel should receive their living from the gospel" (1 Cor. 9:14).

How much do we give to the local congregation? Our only instructions are these: to give regularly (1 Cor. 6:1–2), proportionally (1 Cor. 16:1–2; 2 Cor. 8:12), and generously (2 Cor. 8:20) of our first fruits (Gen. 4:4; Prov. 3:9; Lev. 27:30) with a spirit of eagerness (2 Cor. 9:2), earnestness (2 Cor. 8:7), cheerfulness (2 Cor. 9:7), and love (2 Cor. 8:23).

In other words, giving to the church is not to be an afterthought, given after everything else is spent. In this way, it is deliberate. We give regularly — weekly, bi-weekly, monthly, quarterly, or yearly — keeping in mind our own strengths, weaknesses, and limitations. We set it aside beforehand — before anything else is spent.

From those first fruits, we set aside a proportionate and generous amount. Ten percent was the standard for the Israelites. This was a command for the ancient Israelites. We can give as much as we want, but ask yourself: do we really want to be less generous than was commanded of the Israelites? Is the job of the New Testament Church bigger or smaller than the job given to Israel?


Holy Spirit. This makes giving a joy, as Jesus said, "it is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).
