LOVED AND SENT!

"This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins." – 1 John 4:10

At this year's Best Practices for Ministry conference in Phoenix, one of the keynote speakers was pastor Jeff Cloeter from Christ Memorial Lutheran Church in St. Louis, MO. His session was titled "Loved and Sent." These two words really struck a chord with me and I think they represent much of what "Joining Jesus in our Community" means to us.

As Christians we are first loved by God. This is what draws us to Him, and what gives us our foundation. In essence, being loved by God answers the question — that all of humanity has always asked — "who am I?" It is a question of identity. All too often, we let the world define who we are. We let popular media, or the opinions of others set the stage, and establish the playing field. We buy in and we begin to ask the questions the world asks ... Are we pretty enough? Strong enough? Smart enough? Successful

enough? And whether we find the answers we like to those questions, we still feel uncertain about who we are, so we continue to search for our identity in terms of our jobs. Have you ever done this – you meet someone new and so you ask them,



"what do you do?" ... as if our jobs are our identity. But we are human "beings" not human "doings." Our identity is established by whom we belong TO — we are a loved child of the Most High God! Once we understand this, we gain great strength, confidence, and hope.

With the question of identity firmly settled, and in relationship with Jesus, we move on to the question of **purpose**. For insight into that, we look to Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2). When we do, we discover His purpose and why He came into

RAISING CHEERFUL GIVERS

Part 2—The Value of Work

This is the second in a series of articles on "Raising Cheerful Givers". Helping our children understand financial principles will not only help them manage their money, but also become joyful stewards.

According to a 2003 study, students who worked in high school are much more likely to achieve their financial goals and be knowledgeable about money than those who did not. Working in high school and college, to the extent that it doesn't interfere with schoolwork, seems to pay off later in life. Children can begin to understand the value of reward for work at a very young age. The fact of the matter is that the value of work is much more than just monetary.

Teaching your child the value of work builds character. Children will grow up with more respect for the value of money and what is required to earn it. It also teaches diligence. Diligence is a work ethic that means you do the task set before you to the best of your ability in a timely fashion. Diligence encompasses honesty, purpose, energy, excellence and working heartily. "Whatever you do, do your work heartily, as for the Lord rather than for men." (Colossian 3:23)

When they are too young to "work", children need a source of money that enables them to learn how to

save, spend and share. One such source is an allowance. Sometimes there is debate among parents of whether an allowance is good. Some may feel that children need to understand that as part of a family, they do chores simply for the benefit of the family community. While contributing help to the family unit is very important and right, parents may miss the opportunity of a valuable teaching tool if there is no allowance.

Have you ever been in the store when your child eyes the toy that represents the latest hot "toy craze" or technological gadget that he really needs and he needs it now? Do you hold your ground and simply respond, "No" as you prepare to once again do battle with the crankiness that follows? Or, do you smile and ask your child, "How soon will you have enough money to buy it?"

Whether the money is given or earned, the money is theirs. If they choose to blow the money on the ugliest (in your eyes) and most expensive shoes in the store, let them do it. When they are short on cash, they will realize the benefit of a wiser decision. Keep telling yourself that the reason your children are receiving money is because you want them to learn to manage it. In our next issue, we will further discuss the idea of allowances.

YOUR FAMILY'S FAITH JOURNEY

"Train yourself to be godly. For...godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come."

—1 Timothy 4:7-8, NIV

At-home faith talks are vital for nurturing children spiritually. In *Shift* (Group), Brian Haynes offers these guidelines for family times with Jesus:

Faith talks should occur regularly and be ageappropriate. Each week, set aside time to focus on biblical truth in a relational way.

Faith talks should focus on God's Word. Read the Bible together, celebrate it, and apply it to all aspects of your daily lives.

Faith talks don't have to be difficult or formal. Make them fun! For example, go outside on a hot day and compare standing in the sun and shade. Then read and discuss Psalm 121:5-6.

Faith talks shouldn't depend on children's choices or attitudes. God instructs parents to be intentional about leading their kids spiritually.

MISSION TRIP

This summer's mission trip (Grade 6 thru Adult) will be July 9-14 in San Diego (note the change in location) where we will have the opportunity to partner with a variety of different social service organizations. These include service partners who serve the marginalized—the elderly, the homeless and the hungry. We will also be able to experience the Latino culture of San Diego through some of these partners as well as our housing site at a bilingual church. This will include a bilingual church service and a cookout with the community around the church. You will go right up to the border of Mexico and will learn about the history of the border from an organization that works with immigrants. Cost is \$50 and due now to hold your spot. This includes transportation, food and lodging! Contact Rachelle at om@redeemerbythesea.org to register!

Celebrate New Life After seeing a baptism, talk to your children about their own baptisms—or their desire to be baptized. Tell them Jesus washes away our sins. As a family, make handmade cards for newly baptized people.

God's Relevant Word Show children how the Bible applies to their lives. Talk about biblical heroes and how they both stumble and grow in faith. Tie Bible verses into kids' interests, from music and poetry to travel and adventure.

Lifelong Learners Preteens often feel as if they've outgrown Sunday school. Provide age-appropriate Bibles and devotionals for older kids who are forming their identity in Jesus. Help them anticipate the future, and assure them that Jesus is always with them as they grow.

Family Timelines Tape a long piece of paper to a wall. Together, create a timeline of your family's journey with Jesus using words, drawings, and Bible verses. Add marriages, birthdays, and milestones such as when a child started preschool or you moved. Include fun memories as well as challenges that affected everyone. Then discuss: "What are our best memories? What difficult events have we faced? How did those make us closer to each other and to Jesus? How have we seen God's faithfulness? What dreams do we have as a family?"

Special Sheep Draw a sheep shape on paper. Set out cotton balls and glue sticks. Have family members take turns holding up cotton balls and saying why each person is special. Then dip the cotton in glue and stick it on the sheep. Continue until you have a fluffy reminder that you are all God's special sheep. Read Luke 15:3-7 and say Jesus is a good Shepherd who loves us, his sheep.

God's Path On a map of your hometown or neighborhood, mark important spots such as your home, school, church, friends' houses, and more. Highlight the roads your family uses most often. Read aloud Psalm 139:1-3. Say: "God always knows where we are, what we're doing, and where we're going. He has big plans for us as we grow and get to know him better. Jesus loves us and will always be with us." With a red marker, draw a large heart around all the sites you've highlighted. Display the map as a reminder of God's promises.





SALT & LIGHT

Someone asks you if you practice Christian Citizenship - What do you say? Would you answer yes, just because you don't deliberately break the law, or does the title Christian Citizen convey action to you? (How about this as a minimum: 1. Get informed on the important issues; 2. Know the candidates position on those issues 3. Vote). The bible tells us we should select capable men from all the people—men who fear God as judges and officials. Our challenge is knowing who to select? At Salt & Light we believe this is at the core of the troubles we are seeing today in America. We have (selected) elected people who do not fear God. These ungodly representatives have passed laws and appointed judges who share their strictly secular beliefs. The result is that the Bible, which provides the only complete set of rules for how we should live together in peace, has been removed from the civil arena. What has replaced that 'rule book? The answer is relativism, or said more clearly – 'whatever feels good'. No thought is given to the consequences of this behavior and as we watch families in America disintegrate, many wonder if it is too late to turn back to God. The good news is we know God will give us another chance. as is written in Revelations 2: 4-6 "Nevertheless I have this against you, that you have left your first love. Remember therefore from where you have fallen; repent and do the first works, or else I will come to you quickly and remove your lampstand from its place—unless you repent."

A Focus on the Family - Truth Project lesson titled 'The American Experiment: Stepping Stones' speaks clearly to this subject:

"America is unique in the history of the world. On these shores a people holding to a biblical worldview have had an opportunity to set up a system of government designed to keep the state within its divinely ordained boundaries. Tour #10 follows the history of this experiment and explores what happens to freedom when God is forgotten."

Your Salt & Light group has broken this lesson into three parts to fit within the Sunday morning Bible study time and we will be presenting that to you on three Sundays in the near future. Keep an eye on the weekly bulletin.

We are also looking at another aspect of Christian Citizenship and that is how do we get informed on

today's important issues? To help out, we are researching Planned Parenthood (PP) and intend to produce a one page fact sheet that provides clarity on the main question of how abortion fits into the PP enterprise. As a Christian Citizen we should know about things like this, but we are drowning in conflicting information that seems to tell the story with two completely different answers. Is abortion just a small percent of their business? Would women lose access to comprehensive health care if PP closed? These and other points will be clarified and for those who would like to do further research, we will include our source information.

What is the next step for us as Christian Citizens? Although we just completed a very difficult election cycle, the political parties are already beginning their campaign for 2018. Remember the simple formula – get informed; know the candidates; vote. We plan to help with all three steps.
