"a lighthouse to our community and the world"

"SOLA" Pastor Augie

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast. (Ephesians 2:8-9)

Ephesians 2:8-9 is a sort of "rallying cry" for Lutheran churches, and really for all evangelical churches since the Reformation in the 16th century. In short, this is because Christianity had fallen into a works-righteousness mentality - the idea that people are saved and given eternal life because of things they do (works), rather than because of what Christ has done for us (grace). The Reformation sought to return the Church to an understanding that our eternal salvation is not earned by our works, but rather is a gift of God, given to us freely through the merits of Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son.

Our first message series of the year is going to look at the four "Solas" of the Reformation, which are four phrases that summarize the basic theological principles underlying our faith. These phrases were originally expressed in Latin ("sola" is a Latin word meaning "alone") but take heart, we will be studying them in English!:)

• Sola Scriptura, Scripture alone.

- Sola Gratia, Grace alone.
- Solus Christus, Christ alone.
- Sola Fide, Faith alone.

Each of these are treasures in and of themselves and could serve as the basis of its own message series. To whet your appetite, here is what we'll be discussing in brief:

Scripture Alone: Most Christian denominations (and some Christian-like churches) say that they are using the Bible in their teaching – and even that the Bible is *a* source of Truth. Our understanding, however, is that the Bible is our *sole* source and norm for our teaching and doctrine. That

means that we understand the Bible to be God's inspired and inerrant Holy Word, and as such, we believe that the Bible is God's means for revealing to us Truth. We may use our intellect,



reason and senses, but they are subservient to Scripture. Scripture Alone tells us where we find The Truth.

Grace Alone: Left to our own devices, humankind would be lost in sin and depravity; to suggest that we can somehow save ourselves by our own efforts, not only elevates our goodness and merits far beyond our abilities, but it far diminishes the completed work of Christ on the cross. The understanding of Grace Alone makes clear that we are not saved because of any merit or worthiness in ourselves, but only by the divine goodness of God. God has done all that is necessary for our salvation and He gives it to us as a free gift. This gift comes from the gracious heart of God to us. Grace Alone tells us how our salvation is given.

Christ Alone: There are many churches that use the name Christ, but when you get down to it, the followers of that belief system ultimately put their hope in something else. There are varieties of things that one might put their hope in – reason, senses, science and self are a few. We believe, however, that the ultimate source of our hope is in the accomplished work of Christ on the cross – nothing else. Christ did all that was necessary for our salvation, and is our living and reigning Lord. Our faith is based on Him alone, and not on any other actions, values or name. Christ Alone tells us the source of our salvation and the object of our faith.

Faith Alone: How does a sinner receive God's gracious gift

of salvation? How is a person "made right" with God (justification)? How one answers those questions reveals much about their faith. We believe that there is nothing that we can do to make God love us any more and nothing that we can do to make God love us any less. He loves us because He loves us, and He forgives us because of Continued on back page

What are we about?

The ultimate goal of the Salt & Light Ministry is to see more people being



elected to office who adhere to Biblical teachings. We strive to do this by highlighting the important issues of our time and then providing clarity as to how candidates stand on those issues.

As a part of this, we also delve into exactly what the civic role should be for Christians. The Lutheran Hour Ministries has produced a short, four session study on the Separation of Church & State that we believe will help. Your Salt and Light group is reviewing the material and will plan to present it to you during the Sunday morning Bible Study time. Stay tuned for the dates as we look to fit into the current schedule.

What are we faced with? What would it look like if a game, say football, were played without a rule book? Or, what if we kept the same rules, but over a period of a dozen or so years we remove some pages from the rule book each year? The players who have been playing for many years would be following the entire set of rules, but newer players, who are not privy to the missing pages, would be following only some of the rules. There would be chaos on the field, with the older players not understanding why the newer players seem to ignore the rules. You would need a referee for almost every player, because there would be so many violations.

Now look around today, the Bible (*rule book*) has been removed from the public arena, but what has replaced it? Our Constitution was written for a moral people and too many of the younger generation lack the moral foundation they need to be good citizens. Can we hire enough referees (*a.k.a. police*) to keep up with the moral decline we see all around us?

Even Thomas Jefferson, one of the least religious of the Founding Fathers (a Deist?) kept a Bible with him. He actually cut out the parts he felt were superstition, or miracle related, keeping the remainder that he felt included necessary teachings. President George Washington urged the incorporation of religious principles throughout the public arena. In his famous



You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. Deuteronomy 6:5

Spending time with family in Indianapolis over Christmas was special. My niece and her husband are expecting their first child. I was reminded of how life changes dramatically with baby #1. It's "game on." No one gets a practice round for what is a performance of a life time. There are no secret formulas, however having a clear purpose to parenting is essential. For their children, parents:

- Provide a framework for living and growing
- Equip with a strong sense of identity
- Provide a fixed point of reference

It's this last point that highlights parent's greatest mission that is to nurture a faith in Jesus. This is the priority and greatest privilege of parenthood. It starts in your home. The next several months I will share strategies to pass on the faith to the next generation. They are:

- 1. Leveraging Legacy- what we do today influences a multigenerational cycle of family traits.
- 2. Family Relationships-in this context, children embrace the beliefs and values of parents.
- 3. Point of View- Parents provide a corrective lens of truth to help children navigate the deceiving paths of life.
- 4. More Show than Tell- Our children can only learn what we show them.

These are the principles of Legacy, Likelihood, Lenses and Learning that Kurt Brunner and Steve Stroup highlight in their book It Starts at Home.
