I grew up in a neighborhood that had few fences between properties. There was one house in a cul-de-sac that had a fenced in backyard, where 2 dogs, Boxers roamed and barked. They looked ferocious and we kids were afraid of them. Whenever they were loose in the neighborhood there was great panic. The reality is that these dogs were very friendly and playful. The dogs were no threat, yet we lived and played as if they were. This is a pattern of behavior that is generally true today. We live consistently with what we believe to be true, even when we're wrong or inaccurate. The more our understanding of the world conforms to what is real, the better choices we will make. The more we operate under false assumptions, the more difficult it is to navigate through life. We parents, too often, ask our children to try and navigate through life with a faulty worldview. The consequences can be far worse than frustration and disillusionment. We need to give them a better life map that replaces false directions with the truth. Our children need the corrective lenses of truth found in the Word of God. The transformation spoken about in Romans is a lifelong process of daily being in God's Word. For it is God's Word that changes the misconceptions of our children and replaces them with true understandings, beliefs and perceptions.

STORY' Through Our Children's Eyes! RBTS embarked on a unique journey through scripture. A new Sunday sermon series that lasted from Feb. 22 to Nov. 22, 2015, used a new format from the NIV Bible, called The Story' which provides one continuing story of God and His People. It is written as a novel, that makes the pages of scripture, easy to understand and a way to encourage one to find his or her own story in God's story.











In conjunction with this sermon series, RBTS's Sunday School followed along with an age appropriate version for the children. It provided a unique means and opportunity for parents and children to discuss "The Story", together. To enhance their study, the Sunday School challenged the children to embark on a wonderful project; to walk through the pages of scripture by constructing a diorama of 'the story' interpreted through their eyes. They began construction on June 14th, starting with the 'Garden of Eden', and as their journey continues through the summer, created and built their versions of Noah's Ark, the parting of the Red Sea, and the destruction of the Wall of Jericho and so on.

Watching the enthusiasm and imagination of these children each week as they interpreted the bible was heartwarming, and knowingly, most pleasing to God. Halfway through the journey on August 23, parents and members were given a preview of the children's progress of their studies by viewing the project which provided understanding and encouragement to continue on their way towards completion of their bible study. What a wonderfully spiritual adventure for the children to have a 'hands on', creative experience, 'walking the journey' with Christ thru the pages of the bible's story. It created a 'fun' way for them to explain and to 'make real' the lessons and promises found in the Old Testament and the fulfillment of scripture found through the life and teachings of Christ towards one's faith, salvation, and what lies ahead as believers.









The children's version of 'The Story' was completed just in time to be displayed for all to see on Dec 19^{th,} the Sunday School Christmas Program and Birthday Celebration for Jesus.



The children's diorama remained on display throughout the Christmas season, and received much praise. It was inspirational to all who desires to see Christ through the eyes of a child.
