God is Closer Than You Think

That's right ... He is next door!

And the King will answer them, 'Truly, I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my brothers, you did it to me.' – Matthew 25:40

This is an exciting time for Redeemer! And this month it seems that two themes are coming together in an interesting way. The first is the theme that I wrote about last month: our church's vision for Redeemer to be ***"a church family joining Christ in our community."*** The second, *appears* unrelated, but as I will point out, is actually much related: this month's message theme called ***"God Is Closer Than You Think."*** It's based on a book by John Ortberg, and the premise of the book is that God has "broken" into our world in the person of Jesus Christ, and He promises to remain with us in this world

even though bodily He has risen and ascended into heaven. It is through His Holy Spirit, that He remains with us in presence even though our eyes cannot see Him.

Who among us is not thrilled that Jesus has given us God's Holy Spirit to dwell within us through our baptism? The question I am posing for us to consider is, can we see God's Holy Spirit present and at work *outside* of us? ... even in our community? I believe Jesus has told us that He is. In fact you've probably heard me say at one time or another that "God is always at work." This is something that we are counting on as we set out to

Family Ministry Corner

Train up a child in the way he shall go; even when he is old, he will not depart from it. Proverbs 22:6

As a kid, we had family devotion time right after dinner, most evenings of the week. Sometimes they were boring and awkward, and my siblings and I daydreamed of playing outside with our friends. My parents did their best. My parents like many today have forced this natural and comfortable process into a mold that is unnatural and uncomfortable. There is much going on in the minds of our children. Let's understand those processes first. Our children will only learn when we teach in manner that reaches them.

Genesis 1 tells us that children are made in the image of God. Romans 3 and 5 tells us all children have sinned and fallen short. So our children have some awe-inspiring qualities and characteristics and they also have the same illness as adults, sin.

Here are four truths, of which we as parents need to know the practical implications.

Truth #1- Kids have a rational free will. This gives them the capacity to understand and choose what is right. Parents need to hold kids responsible for their choices and teach them to

counter their sinful impulses rather than excuse them.

Truth #2- Kids have a conscience that they use to distinguish between right and wrong. They at times are confused by its character and can find it difficult to resist instant gratification. Parents must help children develop and maintain an informed and sensitive conscience by clarifying truth from error.

Truth #3- Kids have inborn desire for a relationship with God and others. They resist and may resent any authority that is controlling rather than defining. Parents should expect resistance to authority and instruction, so get beyond surface rebellions and tap into their deeper yearnings, building commitment rather than compliance.

Truth #4- Kids are born with inherent worth and dignity and with a tremendous capacity for good and evil. Parents have to love and forgive their kids unconditionally, but conditionally accept their behavior.

Salt and Light

Today we bring to you a series of importance to all Christians, the *Intersection of Church and State* by the Lutheran Hour Ministries. How and why, as Christians, do we involve ourselves in the political process of America? This series can help guide us in our actions. The political realm, formerly dominated by Christians, is still available to us. It was the use of politics that resulted in the attacks on religious activities and the public acknowledgement of God from public places (such as prayer at athletic events; public acknowledgement of faith at graduation; wearing clothes with religious sayings or symbols, etc) it can therefore restore those principles. We all have excuses why we don't vote or otherwise get involved; what does it matter; elections no longer reflect my values; we are turning into a Godless nation, etc. These are precisely why we, as Christians, must get involved! We need to focus on candidates that represent pro-life, pro-family, and pro-Christian liberties. When we do, it works! In the 2010 elections, the highest evangelical turnout was recorded. 97 new freshman Republicans and Democrats were elected with 81% of those being pro-life, pro-family, and pro-Christian liberties. 16 freshman senators were elected and 13 represented pro-life, pro-family, and pro-Christian liberties. Poll after poll show that majorities of Americans still believe in God and Jesus Christ. The fact is we, the Christian population, are the majority not the minority.

In a recent national election, 5 candidates who stood for returning Godly principles to public affairs were defeated by a collective total of only 57,000 votes. Yet, in those 5 states, there were over 5 million Christians who did not even vote. If only 2% had voted for these candidates, those 5 would have been elected and would have created a 10 vote swing in the Senate. 5 unGodly men would have been retired and 5 Godly men would have taken their place. It shows us that Godly candidates are most often defeated not by activists and radicals, but by inactive Christians.

As Edmund Burke once said:

“All that is necessary for evil to triumph is for good men to do nothing.”

There is much that ‘good men’ can do to stop the triumph of evil. One of the most important is to vote, and to vote Biblically. John Jay, America’s first Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, wrote:

Providence has given to our people the choice of their rulers. It is the duty, as well as the privilege and interest, of our Christian nation to select and prefer Christians for their rulers.

The Salt & Light group believes that we must regain the conviction that Biblical principles are vital to national success, and we must be willing to pursue their reinstatement. In recent times, we have allowed the very principles which produced morality and virtue, and thus national stability, to be restricted in public life. Don't you agree that we once again need to recognize the truth so well understood by George Washington that:

The propitious smiles of Heaven can never be expected on a nation that disregards the eternal rules of order and right which Heaven itself ordained.

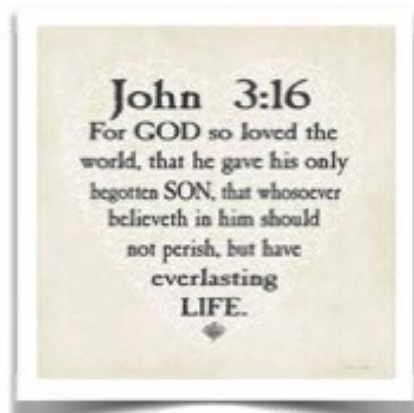

accomplish our vision and goals this year - to discover God at work in our community. That means then that we need not dream up our own activities that *attempt* to do God's work, but rather we simply observe what He has begun and is already doing in our midst and join Him there! If we are going to be about looking for where God is present and at work, perhaps the best place for us to look is in the lives of our neighbors.

Jesus told Parables to His disciples often having to do with neighbors. Perhaps the most memorable is that of the Good Samaritan where the question was asked of Jesus, “who is my neighbor?” Jesus pointed out that our neighbor is the one to whom we show love. He confirms this in another setting: Matthew 25 - only this time He does not speak in a parable, but uses plain language. Jesus tells His disciples that when Judgment Day comes, He will be concerned about how we have showed love to “the least of these.” Why does this matter to Jesus? Because, He says, when you loved them, you were loving Him.

I think it is no accident that our vision emphasis for the year is to join Jesus as He works in our community, and now our first message series following Easter has to do with looking for the presence of God in our lives. I believe Jesus wants us to discover that He is present and at work in the very people around us that we are seeking to reach and serve with the Gospel! Whom might Jesus be directing you to reach and serve with the message and love of Christ? You might be surprised ... you may also discover that God is at work in your life through them too!

I recently read a book where the author pointed out that an important part of spiritual growth and even conversion to faith, comes through what he calls “providential relationships.” The idea being that when people tell their faith stories, they invariably include the work of Jesus that they saw in another person. It may be a couple who just “showed up” in their lives, or a person that talked to them about Jesus, or a teacher that really opened the Scriptures to them. Whatever the case, there was a relationship where they felt the love of Jesus coming through. And the thing is, you and I cannot manufacture these relationships ... but we can work to create “margin” in our lives for these relationships to form.

It's my goal and prayer that we continually ask these complementary questions this month (and beyond):

1. How can I join Jesus where He is already working in my neighbors' lives? And
2. How is Jesus revealing himself to me in His Word and the people and circumstances around me?

I'm increasingly viewing our world as not just a “waiting room” to get into heaven, but rather a place where Heaven has broken through, and a place that Jesus is already transforming by his grace. You do not need to wait until you die to be in the presence of God.

He is closer than you think.
