A Sent People

We have just finished a message series on The Beatitudes called "Bless This Home." The Beatitudes are the first twelve verses of Matthew chapter 5 in which Jesus begins The Sermon on the Mount. Immediately after concluding The Beatitudes, Jesus says (emphasis mine):

13 "You are the salt of the earth. But if the salt loses its saltiness, how can it be made salty again? It is no longer good for anything, except to be thrown out and trampled underfoot.

14 "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden.
15 Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to

everyone in the house. ¹⁶ In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." – Matthew 5:13-15

What do salt and light have in common? Answer: They just *are*. Salt is salt. It is not complicated. It is what it is, and it does what it does. Light is **Light. It shines. That's just what it** does. What this means is that Jesus simply calls us to be what we are ... what He has made us ... salt and light.

And what does that look like? Salt seasons things. It makes food taste better. It preserves and adds flavor. It can even heal. What about light? Light brightens dark places and

Salt & Light

CAN YOUR VOTE REALLY MAKE A DIFFERENCE? Of course it can! The great American author Mark Twain wrote in Collier's Magazine (Sept. 2, 1905) It will be conceded that a Christian's first duty is to God. It then follows, as a matter of course, that it is his duty to carry his Christian code of morals to the polls and vote them... If Christians of America could be persuaded to vote God and a clean ticket, it would bring about a moral revolution that would be incalculably beneficent. It would save the country.

The same is true today. There are somewhere between 60-90 million voting age Christians in the United States. Over the past 25 years, presidential elections have been decided by less than 10 million votes. Yet, generally about 50% of those Christian voters actually vote. In past articles we have documented that when Christian voters are motivated to increase their voting participation, Godly men and women are elected and biblical values are supported. When Christian voters decrease, the results are that biblical values are all but forgotten. Therefore, Christians need to ALWAYS VOTE even when you are troubled that neither candidate is your first choice. When a Christian votes, he or she is either voting for God or against Him. Shouldn't God's Truth rate higher than foreign, domestic, economic, or party loyalty considerations?

The importance of this citizen participation was understood by our Founding Fathers and we need to understand the need today is just as great. The Salt & Light group is committed to helping members at Redeemer understand the impact Christians can have by staying engaged in our civil governance. 

7 Habits of Highly Effective Stewards

Much has been written about the habits it takes to be a highly effective person, or a highly effective family or a highly effective teen. This seven-part series will reflect on the habits of a highly effective steward. Since stewardship is a part of discipleship, and discipleship is a journey for each of us, we hope that these habits will help us reflect on this area of our Christian life.

Habit 1: Be Thankful

"In everything give thanks; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (I Thess. 5:18) Talk about an attitude of gratitude! What does giving thanks in "everything" mean for daily living? Do we thank God for the blessings of life the big things and the small things, the obvious and the not so obvious? Food and shelter are basic necessities. Family and friends provide meaning and fellowship. Good health is important to our general well being. Though we enjoy these gifts each day, it is easy to take them for granted and not express our appreciation. What about your job? Do we view it as our vocation? The word "vocation" literally means "calling". We usually think of a calling as being related to some kind of ministry. But God calls and equips all of us so that, by the quality of our work in our vocation He is honored and we reflect His image...no matter what our "work" is. Col. 3:23-24 says, "Whatever you do, work heartily, as for the Lord and not for men.... You are serving the Lord Christ." If we could see Jesus Christ as our boss, would it change our attitude about our job? Let's face it: some of us have a kind of love/hate relationship with work. We spend roughly a third of our adult lives making a living and what is our attitude about that? Work is not just a means to a paycheck. It is a gift from God to help develop

character. It is an opportunity to be a Christ-like example to those with whom we work. It motivates us to be productive and to achieve a sense of accomplishment and value. As Christians we can say, "All this, and a paycheck too"! A steward's heart is a thankful heart. Someone has said it well: "Thanksgiving, to be truly thanksgiving, is first thanks, then giving." You can give without being thankful, but you cannot be thankful without giving. When you give, you not only are acknowledging that everything you have is a gift from God, but you are expressing your gratitude to Him.

illuminates our paths. Light is good. By being present in the world and pointing people to Jesus we are being salt and light where God has placed us - in our neighborhoods and communities. We bring the counter-cultural Kingdom of God (The Beatitudes show how different God's Kingdom is) into the culture of our world.

At Redeemer by the Sea we have a long history of viewing God's mission as being a lighthouse. The challenge with a lighthouse, however, is that it is stationary. We are now beginning to understand that our Lord calls us not to hide our light, but to make it visible. Even though our building itself is situated on a on a high hill, we must admit that it can remain obscured, covered, and even invisible to much of our community. That is why we are beginning to recognize that God is calling us to move out into our community, joining Him in His mission there. I heard this expression that explains it well ... "God's Church doesn't have a mission -God's mission has a Church." We as God Church, His people, join Him in His mission and we do that by being salt and light wherever we go.

Matthew chapter 28 is well known for Jesus commissioning His people to make disciples as we are going through life. However, it can often be difficult to move into new territories and into new places. That is why we take comfort in the prophets and the people of God that have gone before us. Consider Abram in Genesis chapter 12. God simply sent Abram. He did not give Abram all the details. There were some big unknowns, and certainly Abram had to leave his comfort zone. But he did, because it was God who was

sending. And what was God sending Abram to? ... A new land and a new people; to make his life in that place and in so doing to become a blessing to those who would follow. God wanted Abram to transform the community to which God was sending him. Through Abraham (God's new name for the transformed Abram) God would make for Himself a people: a holy nation dedicated to His glory.

We can also take comfort in the prophet Isaiah, who when called by God (Isaiah 6) was terrified. Isaiah did not believe he was equipped for the role that God was giving him. He was worried about his ability to speak and represent a holy and righteous God. And yet as the angel takes the coal from the altar and places it on Isaiah's lips, God communicates that He is doing for Isaiah what Isaiah cannot do for himself. He is atoning for Isaiah's sins. And while it may sound cliché, God does not call the equipped, He equips the called.

And so it is with you and me. God has called us not to simply remain holed up inside our sanctuary; inside the familiar comfort of our church family. We certainly enjoy that family, and we rejoice to be refreshed by Word and

Sacraments, with praises filling the house of the Lord. But we realized that those are the tools given us to equip us for our mission to be a sent people joining Jesus on His mission to seek and save the lost. Those are the marks of a people being salt and light wherever God sends us.
