


The Kingdom is not **PHYSICAL** or Geographical.

Jesus said, "<u>My kingdom</u> is <u>not of this</u> <u>world</u>. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jews. But now my kingdom is from another place." (John 18:36) The Kingdom of Heaven = The <u>**REIGN**</u> of God.

Jesus said, "My kingdom is not of this world. If it were, my servants would fight to prevent my arrest by the Jews. But now my <u>kingdom</u> is <u>from another</u> <u>place</u>." (John 18:36) How awesome is the LORD Most High, the great <u>King</u> over all the earth! (Psalm 47:2) In those days John the Baptist came, preaching in the Desert of Judea 2 and saying, "Repent, for the <u>kingdom of</u> <u>heaven is near</u>." (Matthew 3:1)

The Kingdom is **SPIRITUAL**.

For the <u>kingdom of God</u> is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in <u>the</u> <u>Holy Spirit</u>, (Romans 14:7)

Why Did Jesus Teach In Parables? To <u>CONCEAL</u>

He replied, "The knowledge of the <u>secrets</u> of the kingdom of heaven has been given to you, <u>but not to them</u>. (Matthew 13:11)

Why Did Jesus Teach In Parables? To <u>REVEAL</u>

But blessed are your eyes for they see, and your ears for they hear; for assuredly, I say to you that many prophets and righteous men desired to see what you see, and did not see it, and to hear what you hear, and did not hear it. (Matthew 13:16-17)

3. THE PARABLE OF THE SOWER

For this people's <u>heart has become</u> calloused;

they hardly hear with their ears, and they have <u>closed their eyes</u>.... (Matthew 13:15)

Who is "The **Sower**?"

He answered, "The <u>one who sowed</u> the good seed is the Son of Man.

(Matthew 13:37)

What is "The **Seed**?"

When anyone hears <u>the message</u> about the <u>kingdom</u> ...

(Matthew 13:19)

The "Wayside/<u>PATH</u>"

when anyone hears the message about the kingdom and <u>does not understand</u> it, the <u>evil one comes and snatches</u> away what was sown in their heart. This is the seed sown along the <u>path</u>. (Matthew 13:4, 19)

The "Stony/<u>ROCKY</u> Places"

The seed falling on <u>rocky ground</u> refers to someone who hears the word and at once receives it with joy. 21 But since <u>they have</u> <u>no root</u>, they last only a short time. (Matthew 13:5, 20)

The "Among the **THORNS**"

The seed falling among the thorns refers to someone who hears the word, but the <u>worries of this life</u> and the <u>deceitfulness of</u> <u>wealth</u> choke the word, making it unfruitful. (Matthew 13:7, 22)

The "GOOD Soil"


