### A FAITH THAT WORKS

Speaking as someone who is celebrating a birthday this month I can say that often it feels better to say that I'm "maturing" rather than getting older. Of course when I was younger being mature still sounded like being old. So I guess there's no way around it the two sort of mean the same thing. And yet they don't.

We must admit that it's possible to grow older but not necessarily to mature. I think we all know those people who are up and age but never outgrew the immaturity of their youth. Maturity is also not the same as experience. It's been said that a person may have 20 years of experience — but that just may mean they've had one year of experience 20 times over. In other words, they are not necessarily learning from their experiences; they are just repeating the

same mistakes over and over. Maturity, however, learns from its experience.

Maturity also has nothing to do with our achievements or academic degrees. A person may accomplish a number of things or have a string of letters behind their name and still be immature. I am sure we all know someone like this.

So what is maturity? And in particular, what is *spiritual* maturity? That is what we are going to be discussing the next few months at Redeemer by the Sea as we go through the book of James verse by verse. James is one of those books that you love to hate and you hate to love. James pulls no punches. He says so many things that we need to hear, but do not *want* to hear. The Apostle says things like:

"Consider it pure joy, my brothers and sisters, whenever you face trials of many kinds" – James 1:2

#### **FAMILY MINISTRY CORNER**

Each of us is the result of the forces within our environment and how we responded. Our faith, parents, significant relationships and experiences have profoundly shaped our character and attitudes. Establishing the limits of the environment in which our children grow is an essential task of parents. Guiding and modeling responses to life experiences is just as critical. We also teach those boundaries to the environment in which they have their being. Modeling is different than teaching. Children look, listen and observe how adults operate within their environment. They watch and emulate us. Doing something is how we each internalize that value, making it a part of ourselves. It's making the fact a reality. These tools work in concert, shaping, molding and influencing our children's environment and life.



Gayle Timken will be the group leader, and she is a very talented discussion leader of God's Word. The member books will be \$15 and the sign up sheet will be in the lobby.



#### SALT & LIGHT

We are living in troubled times, but when are they not? Every period of time has its challenges. Life is never perfectly in order. However, what Christians are experiencing is unlike any other time in America. A nation founded on religious principles and acknowledgement that civil liberties are Godgiven, inalienable and self-evident, has been challenged. Churches are now forced by the government to pay for abortions. Or the government granting rights to minorities at the expense of 1st Amendment religious liberties.

It found, among other things, that they would like to see their church more involved in the political process by hearing what the Bible has to say about today's social and political issues. (3) We lose our religious freedom because of apathy, ignorance, and hostility toward religion. Our best hope for the future is when the Church reengages in these important issues.

# 7 HABITS OF A HIGHLY EFFECTIVE STEWARD

Habit 3: Be Content

We live in a world of obsession with material possessions. Far too many of us find ourselves in debt because we've been swept up in the frenzy of accumulation. In our consumerist society, it is difficult to distinguish between our needs and our wants and desires. We often believe that the more money have, the happier we will be.

There's an interesting paradox when we finally recognize that nothing we have really belongs to us. Even though we have many things, none of them actually belongs to us. As we come to understand that everything belongs to God, our perspective changes...we become more content.

"Keep your lives free from the love of money and be content with what you have, ..." (Hebrews 13:5) A Christian steward is content because he knows that God will give him everything he needs. In speaking at a regional conference, Ted Boers, Chair of a stewardship task force, indicated he had just read a book by a secular author entitled, Want What You Have. Ted commented, "This was the secular author's secret to happiness, but what a great way of restating the truth of Hebrews 13:5 ... want what you have!"

We wrestle with the question, "How much is enough?" most of our lives. What is the limit? As Christians, we need to actively seek God's guidance to help us continually differentiate between our real needs, and our wants and desires.

Accept God's provision in your life, and find contentment in the source, not the supply. (I Timothy 6: 6-8).






Perhaps it's fitting that we begin this journey as the Summer
