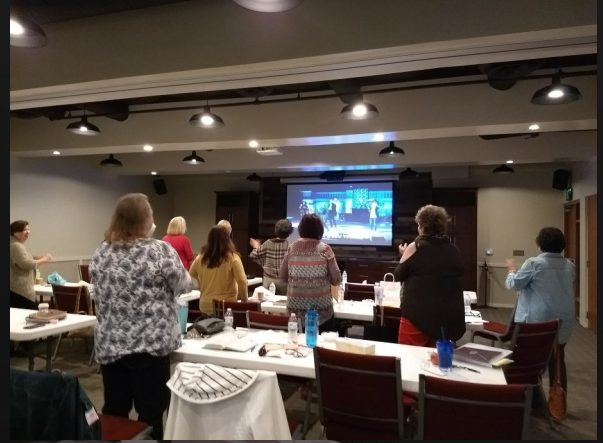
REMODEL PROJECT

After some good initial progress, we came to a bit of a rough patch. There were some problems getting the painting work completed and unfortunately that affected the other downstream work. Some remedial actions have been taken and it looks like we are getting back on track. Here are the remaining steps of the project.

Fellowship Hall: The AV equipment is being 'turned on' and we are now able to use the new projector.

The counter top has been ordered; the painting touchup and staining the doors is underway.

The last step will be replacing the carpet with the new carpet squares.

Lobby: Countertop has been ordered; there is some remaining trim work and painting (of course) and the last 'new' item will be overhead signage. That last step is still on the drawing board.

Sanctuary: The Choir Loft carpet seams need to be completed and the access door to the AV connections needs to be refitted. The handrails need a coat or two more varnish and there is a need to install guides on the floor of the steps for the chairs, to maintain the full pathway on each level. The last items are the speaker and choir mics that are to be installed on the ceiling.

Classrooms: The insulation and down pointing lights are in place, so as far as the remodel project, the rooms are complete. The air ducts and other ceiling object may be painted later, but that will be done after the larger remodel project is complete.

We are a bit behind schedule and your patience through the dust and dirt is much appreciated. As we have noted before, the goal for this project is maximizing the usefulness of our facility and we are seeing that goal being met. Both the existing and future ministry programs will benefit from these quality enhancements.

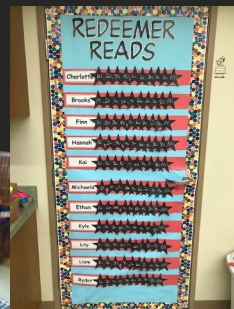

PARENTING CHRISTIAN KIDS: EMPHASIZE AND MODEL RESPECT

"Don't just pretend to love others. Really love them. ... Love each other with genuine affection, and take delight in honoring each other." —Romans 12:9-10, NLT

The Bible is our best resource for training children to act respectfully. When you hear these common phrases from your kids, offer the biblical corrections that follow:

"You're not my boss!" —Romans 13:1

"Why do I have to do that?" —Philippians 2:5-7

"She hit me first!" —1 Thessalonians 5:15

"He's stupid!" —Ephesians 4:29

"You're not my friend anymore!" —Ephesians 4:32

Charting the Course Together, make a Respect Chart, similar to a chart you may use for weekly chores. Add a square for each family member for every day of the week. After dinner, share ways you've each displayed respect that day. Add stickers and then celebrate when the chart is full.

Bridging the Gap Connect so your bodies can form a bridge across a large room. One person starts by touching a wall with a body part; then everyone else must connect to reach the opposite wall. If you get stuck, use clothing (socks, belts, shoelaces, etc.) to bridge the gaps. Afterward, discuss how everyone mattered in order to achieve the goal. Also talk about ways we can honor and "support" one another.



Certificates of Honor Search online for free certificate templates. Print one for each family member and fill in the person's name, as well as ways he or she shows honor and respect to others.

Beach Ball Madness Form a circle. Say, "Let's play the game. Go!" Throw a beach ball into the circle without instructions. When family members are stumped, say: "Toss the ball until everyone has a turn. Remember that pattern and keep following it, going faster and faster." Afterward ask:

"What was it like to receive no instructions at first? Why do rules make games more fun? How are the Ten Commandments like rules to a game? How do the Ten Commandments make it easier to live with other people?"

ASK GOD:

1. To help your family respect and honor God in all you do.
2. To guide you as you model respect for your children.
3. To lead your children to live respectfully toward God, other people, and themselves.

TEACHABLE MOMENTS

Worthy of Honor

You'll need a blue ribbon (or one made from paper), as well as a safety pin or tape. Sit in a circle and place the ribbon on a family member. Then take turns saying kind things about that person and applauding for him or her. Let everyone have a turn wearing the ribbon and receiving compliments.

Ask: How did it feel when others said nice things about you and clapped for you?

Read aloud Deuteronomy 5:16. Say: This verse talks about parents, but God wants us to honor everyone—even ourselves.

Ask: How did our words and actions honor the person wearing the ribbon?

Say: Saying nice things and clapping aren't the only ways to honor and respect someone. Ask: What else can we do to show honor and respect? How can we honor God? How can we honor ourselves?

Close in prayer, asking Jesus to help you show honor and respect to all.

All Around the Neighborhood

Using graham crackers, frosting (or cream cheese), and snack items, create small houses. Then have family members trade houses. Read Luke 10:25-37. Say: "Just as we gave up a snack we really wanted, the good Samaritan gave up time and money to care for a stranger. He knew Jesus wants us to love and respect everyone as our neighbor." Eat the houses while brainstorming ways to show respect to all your "neighbors."

Up to the Challenge Have family members huddle closely. Tie them together with twine or rope. Have the group try to move through an obstacle course carefully. Debrief the experience by asking: "How did you have to change your usual behavior to do this? What are some challenges of living and working with others?" Read aloud Psalm 119:15-16. Say: "God's Word offers lots of guidance for how we can respect one another."

SALT & LIGHT

Question - Should a Christian be involved in 'earthly' politics? Obedience and good citizenship are a part of our life of faith because God works through the governing authorities for our benefit. While the Bible does not talk about a Christian citizen in today's vernacular, Scripture does provide clarity on a Christian's civil responsibilities - Scripture says to obey the Civil Authority! Do you know that included on the short list of citizen responsibilities the government requires: **1. Stay informed of the issues affecting your community. 2. Participate in the democratic process.** While the Bible does not specify any particular form of government, in America we have a Representative Democracy and our Civil Authority is instructing us to get informed and to vote!

1 Peter 2:13-14 ⁴³ *Submit yourselves for the Lord's sake to every human authority: whether to the emperor, as the supreme authority, ¹⁴ or to governors, who are sent by him to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right."*

Leaders are spoken of many times in Scripture, including the need to select good ones. God has delegated authority to human government and while we do not want a Church State, nor do we want State Church, we do want Godly leaders.

Exodus 18:21 *"But select capable men from all the people—men who fear God, trustworthy men who*

hate dishonest gain—and appoint them as officials over thousands, hundreds, fifties and tens."

1 Peter 4:10 *"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."*

As far as understanding how we participate in the democratic process, is our challenge in understanding Scriptural guidance due to semantics? Are our elected leaders the ones Scripture speaks of when it instructs that if your gift is to lead, you are to do so diligently? Are those leaders the ones we are to 'encourage', or in today's language 'elect'? Do 'works' include protecting Christians and churches in the free exercise of their civil and religious liberties?

Romans 12:4-8 ⁴ *For just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, ⁵ so in Christ we, though many, form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. ⁶ We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; ⁷ if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; ⁸ if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully."*

James 2:14-17, 25-26 ¹⁴ *What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? ¹⁵ Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. ¹⁶ If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? ¹⁷ In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. ²⁵ In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction? ²⁶ As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead."*

Scripture also provides information about what happens when we do not follow God's plan.

Proverbs 29:2 *"When the righteous are in authority, the people rejoice; But when a wicked man rules, the people groan."*

We should not be so heavenly-minded that we are of no earthly good. If you want to know more, we meet 2nd and 4th Monday each month, 10:30 AM to noon. Contact me or Jerry Meyer for more information.

DARING FAITH..., *CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1*

For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed—a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: “The righteous will live by faith.” – Romans 1:17

On Easter Sunday this year, we discussed **what** we believe about Jesus – His life, death and resurrection; and **why** we believe it – the evidence and testimony revealed and recorded in the Bible. Now in this series we will discuss **how** this faith changes us – transforming the way we view and interact with our world!

May 20 – **What Happens When You Have Faith** – We will learn what happens when we see with eyes of faith instead of eyes of fear.

May 27 – **Daring to Give God My Best** – We will learn from the Biblical examples of a soldier, an athlete and a farmer how to give our very best to God.

June 3 – **Daring to Imagine** – We will learn how our imagination and our faith work together to cause us to dream “God-sized” dreams and imagine the world the way that God already sees it!

June 10 – **Daring to Commit** – We will explore our deepest needs in life, and the importance of making commitments in each of these areas. Doing so will strengthen our faith and our relationships with others.

June 17 – **Daring to Plant in Faith** – We will look at God’s laws of planting and harvesting. From them, we will learn that our relationships, our health, our finances, our careers, and other areas of our life follow the same laws.

“I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms...” – Ephesians 1:18-20
