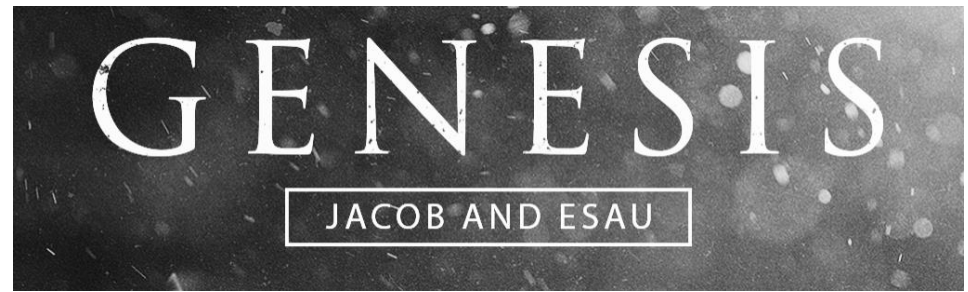

- Describe the sequence of events that led to reconciliation between Jacob and Esau.
- Whose job was harder – Jacob's or Esau's?
- How is love involved in forgiveness and reconciliation?
- How did Christ's love for us reconcile us to God?
- Do you live like God has forgiven you?
- Or do you act as though you are still an enemy of God?
- What are you missing out on if you do not receive God's love and forgiveness?
- Do you know anyone who is still in hiding, believing that God wants nothing to do with them?
- What might you tell them?



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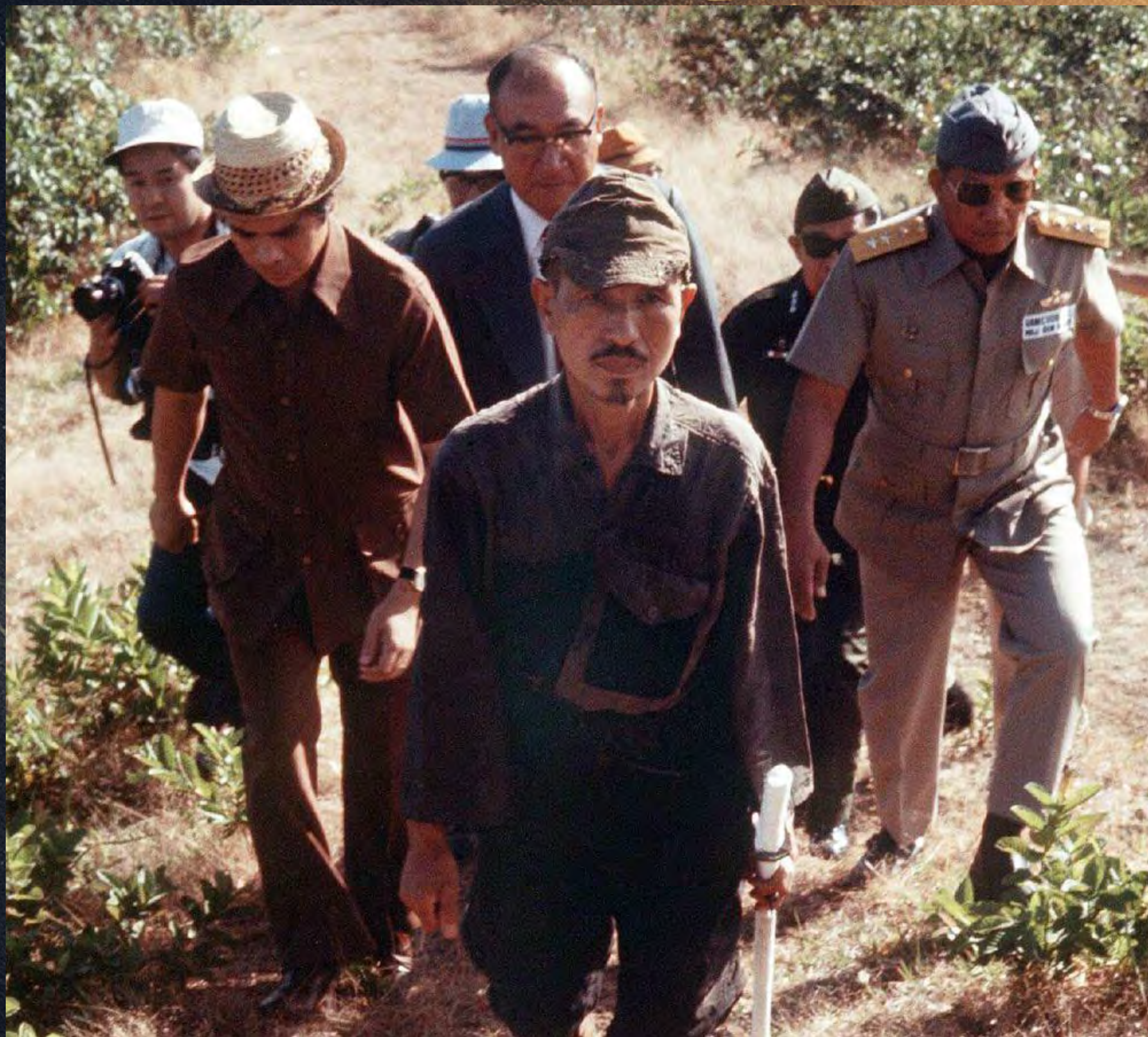
