Lord, where people have hurt me and I'm not ready to forgive, soften my heart and cause me to be able to forgive. Help me to spend more time in your Word so that I appreciate who I am as your child, and so that all I seek to do for you grows out of my relationship with you. And help me to understand and appreciate the forgiveness you have won for me that has restored my relationship with my Heavenly Father. In Jesus' Name. Amen!



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
