Who might God be calling you to share your story of faith with? – remember, "Don't talk to that person about God until you talk to God about that person." Pray!

<u>Pray</u>: Heavenly Father, thank you that you have given us the treasure of your Gospel to carry in imperfect jars of clay. Help us not to keep that treasure to ourselves, but to share it with those who desperately need it! And Lord, help us to recount the great work that you have done in our lives – how we are changed because of you – so that we can share that with others. Remind us Lord that you call us to go, but that we do not go alone – you go with us. And remind us that while we carry the message, it is your Holy Spirit that changes hearts. May we spread the seed of your Word liberally, and allow your Holy Spirit to work in many hearts through us. May there be more people in heaven on the Last Day because of what we do today. In Jesus' Name. Amen.
