How does Christ's divinity rescue you from your humanity? Read Acts 17, how would you describe God to an unbeliever? Read Romans 8, how would you describe God's hope to a hopeless or lost person?

Pray: Heavenly Father, thank you that you have revealed yourself to us, both in your magnificent creation and in your Holy Word. But especially Lord, thank you for revealing yourself to us as God in the flesh through Jesus Christ. Help me to settle the question of your real existence and simply to trust in you for all things. Cause me to find hope in your promises - not just in life eternal, but life in the here and now because you are not only real, but you are present with me. Lord, since you are God and are powerful over all things, help me to cast my anxiety on you and to trust you with my broken, messy, sinful, and real life! Transform me with your love so that I can bring your real love and real hope to those around me. In Jesus' Name, Amen.




